She says she has never liked nursg, but that was all that was open to do to do, at one time; that she can leave Severalls Hosp; that she has saved up some money and is also in receipt of a mthly. allowance from parents in U.S.A. - 4.3.42. (contd) intelligent girl; speaks perfect English. Sent her along to Garfield Hse, to see Matron. Came back later to report (GM/89) that she likes the Hostel very much. Will let us know exact date she intends to come to London, will prob. be abt. Apl. 6th.  
(Was interviewed by Miss Morris, in Miss Feldman's absence - on welfare visit).
- 14.3.42. Girl wrote to say that she will be comg. on Apl.6th. (GM/89)
- 17.3.42. Miss Feldman wrote to Miss Penman, Reg. 4, informg. her. (GM/89) Reservation made at Garfield Hse. for Marianne (letter sent to Mr. Emms).
- 24.3.42. Girl wrote to say she wd. ~~not~~ be comg. 3ndays earlier(Apl.3rd). (GM/89) Miss Stewart given report on girl, and that we have asked girl to call when she arrives in London.
- 7.4.42. Girl called. She likes it very much indeed at Hostel. Sent her to Miss Stewart re. job. Girl was sent to Lab. Exch, and was given address of Heinz' factory, where she wd. have part-time work, labellg. bottles and boxes - she cd. then study rest of time. Sd. she wd. let us know result and if she got job. (Miss Feldman saw Marianne).
- 8-4-42. Letter from the Matron of the Severalls Mental Hospital, Colchester LHS. addressed to Miss Penman in Cambridge stating that Marianne resigned her post as a nurse at this hospital on the 27th March adding that the Medical Superintendent did not know if the "Stand Still" order applied to her and was writing to the Board to find out. In the meantime Marianne "absconded". It thus appears that Marianne left against the wish of the Authorities and very suddenly.

- 24-4-42. T.l recd. Girl at Heinz' factory, Waxlow Rd. Harlesden, N.W.10. LHS. doing part-time dehydration-plant worker @ 1ld. per hr. for 4 hrs. every day except Saturday.
- 4.9.42. Letter sent to girl, re. High Holyday hospitality.
- 9.9.42. Letter retd, marked 'gone away'. 'Phoned Garfield House, and Miss (GM/89) Wilson, Matron, sd. that Marianne had moved on 25.7.42, to N.W.6. district. New address noted.
- 10.9.42. Miss Feldman sent letter to girl, statg. surprised that she had not informed us that she had moved; enclosg. copy of 4.9.42. letter (GM/89) also asked her how she is gettg. on and what kind of work now doing, and enclosed T.l.
- 13.10.42. As no reply recd. from girl, asked for home to be visited. (GM/89)
- 16.10.42 Visit arranged. EX/AM Also written about re-emigration possibility. EX/AM
- 21.10.42. Visited by Miss Smith. Gd. bedroom indqte. nice flat. Did not see girl, but Mrs. Spitz says she is a v. gd. girl. Pays 35/- (GM/89) incl. Works for Johnson & Co, 32, Foley St, W.1, as Fixer - Gov. work - tailorg, earng. £2 p.w. No eveng. classes.
- 2.11.42. Girl called to see Mrs. Exiner re. re-emigratn. possibility. Came into Miss Feldman, too. Is still studyg. at Birbeck Col- (GM/89) lege at wk-ends. Hears from parents in U.S.A.
- 7.12.42 Ex. Visa appr. rec. Emigration in progress. Mrs. Exiner dealing.
- 5-3-43. Girl called, dissatisfied with present work (still working for LHS. Johnson & Co.) Now earning £2.5.- p.w. A scheduled firm. She wishes to get into munitions work, but in view of probable re-emigration was told of difficulties re permit and being not yet 20 may be refused M/L permission to leave scheduled uniform firm. Was advised to discuss position with Hanover House as it is always possible to apply for cancellation of A.W.S. Permit 3 months stip-  
ulation. (P/L 12-3-43.)
- 20.3.43. Marianne called in. Has violent toothache and asked if we cd. recommend a dentist. 'Phoned Mr. Orlay, who agreed to see her. Gave (GM/89) her letter of introduction. Girl will be able to pay for treatment. Marianne sd. that she had today recd. her Shipping Coupon, and so she has decided to remain in her job now altho' she has recd. cancellation of AWS permit.
- 24.3.43. Estimate for 32/- for treatment, recd. from Mr. Orlay. (GM/89).
- 25.3.43. Letter to girl, tellg. her that if she cannot pay for treatment in one sum, we feel sure that Mr. Orlay will accept wkly. payments from (GM/89) her. *swr copy of this letter to Mr. Orlay.*

7.9.43: Marianne came in to inform us that she had changed her address. Has now taken a room with a cooking stove as she is anxious to start practical cooking. Marianne informed me that her parents had not consented to her marriage, but were anxious for her to come to America first, then her fiance could follow. If they approved when they saw him they will certainly give their consent. then.
